- ❖ Agenda
 - The agenda was approved by the committee.
 - The minutes from our 1.8.2020 meeting were read by Ms. McKinley and approved by the committee.
- ❖ Ms. Ramirez, with the assistance of the other school nurses, provided the committee an update on sickness across the district. Ms. Ramirez and Ms. Walraven reported that attendance at LDHS and LDMS were normal for this time of year and they had not detected a spike in flu cases. Ms. Neal said that Corinth Elementary had experienced decrease attendance toward the end of last week and continuing thus far this week.
- ❖ Beth Bergeron, from Refuge for Women of North Texas gave the committee a report on sex trafficking. Texas is a leading state for the number of prosecutions for this crime. The average age of victims in Denton County is 13 years old. The typical offender is an adult male who:
 - Targets a Victim
 - Gains their Trust
 - Fills a Need
 - Isolates them from their friends and family
 - Abuses the VictimSex Trafficking is financially lucrative and always involves coercion or fraud. The offenders often use fake social media accounts to troll for potential victims. Refuge for Women gives victims a resource to get away from their victims and start a new life. Ms. Bergeron is currently working with our high school health classes to increase student awareness. This is part of compliance with HB 111. Since the victims average age in Denton County is 13, we are exploring ways to get the information to middle school students.
