- ❖ Meeting: LDISD Central Services Meeting Room E, 9.18.2019. Alicia McKinley called the meeting to order at 3:01 p.m.

- ❖ Agenda
 - The agenda was approved by the committee.
 - The minutes from our 2.8.19 meeting were read by Ms. McKinley and approved by the committee.
- ❖ Ms. McKinley reviewed the SHAC bylaws and responsibilities. Ms. Bondurant ask about how the committee reported to the Board. Mr. Clark said the Board report was a compilation of the meeting minutes from each SHAC meeting. It is delivered at the March Board meeting.
- ❖ Mr. Clark reported on the additional responsibilities placed on SHAC committees due to the 86th Legislative Session. He mentioned that Senate Bill 11 added suicide to the mental health curriculum and increasing parent awareness regarding risky student behaviors. Additionally, he mentioned new statements that SHAC is required to issue.
- ❖ Ms. Ramirez reported on HB 496, which requires districts to maintain “bleed stations”. “Bleed stations” provide on the scene care in the event of a traumatic injury. Staff must be trained and students in grades 7-12 must be offered the training. Lake Dallas plans to store these stations near the AEDs at each campus.
- ❖ Mr. Clark summarized the current status of Heath Instruction. Lake Dallas uses Denton Friends of the Family to provide relationship training (3 hour program) during the last week of the first nine-weeks. We combine substance abuse into Red Ribbon week and we use Living Choices of North Texas for sex education. It is a week long program. Mr. Clark agreed to investigate if these outside resources are used in the middle school health classes, since they are for high school credit.
- ❖ Mr. Clark gave the committee an overview of the Threat Assessment Team process.
- ❖ Ms. McKinley adjourned the meeting at 4:04.
