- ❖ Agenda
  - Reviewed and approved minutes for the SHAC meeting held on 1.07.2015
  - Report on current health threats by Ms. Karen Lawson. Her report included information regarding Chikungunya, which is similar to The West Nile Virus in that he is caused by mosquito bite. The symptoms are not as severe as those associated with The West Nile Virus, but because it can be spread from infected person to mosquito and then to another person, the threat cannot be localized as is the case with The West Nile Virus. There were 66 cases in Texas in 2014, 7 of which were from Denton County. Ms. Lawson also reported on the recent outbreak of the measles. There were 600 cases in the U.S. during 2014 and 67 already in January, 2015. There is a 90% chance of infection if an unvaccinated individual is in the same room as an infected person. She also discussed the vaccination rate for our school district and Denton ISD, but the numbers may overstate the actual number of unvaccinated individuals for several reasons.
  - Mr. Clark showed a PowerPoint from the Drug and Alcohol Report, which was derived from the survey taken at Lake Dallas High School in January of 2014. In general, the report reflects declining tobacco, drug and alcohol use in comparison to previous surveys at Lake Dallas High School and in comparison to the state. The committee was interested in comparing data from Denton ISD, Little Elm ISD and Lewisville to see how we are doing relative to those districts. Mr. Clark agreed to investigate and report to the committee via email.
  - Mr. Clark presented the Coordinated School Health Resource Data Sets to the committee to consider ways to make this available to the public and district providers.
  - The committee briefly discussed an article about concussions and Ms. Lawson reported the concussion protocol created for LDISD students.
